PART 1

IDIOMS RELATED TO ANIMALS / BIRDS

(Idioms with the words *albatross, ant, bear, beaver, bee, bird, bull, butterfly, calf, camel, canary* and *cat*)


Note: M refers to Meaning and U to Usage in a sentence

1. Albatross around one's neck

M: a burden one has to carry as a consequence of a previous misdeed

U: Raghavan might have become a director of the company but early in his career he was involved in a forgery case and this misdeed remained an albatross around his neck.

(Note: An albatross is a large web-footed bird with a hooked beak and long narrow wings.)



2. Have *ants* in one's pants

M: to be agitated or restless

U: Suresh was so tense and restless in the examination hall that his friends asked him if he had ants in his pants.

3. *Bear market*

M: a period when investors expect financial losses and are likely to sell shares


U: A wise investor can pick up stocks at a bargain during a bear market phase.

4. Eager *beaver*:

M: one who shows keen interest

U: Sudha is an eager beaver and is likely to be promoted soon.

(Note: *A beaver is a large water animal with webbed feet and sharp incisors. It gnaws and fells trees to build dams and other under-water structures.*)



5. Have a *bee* in one's bonnet

M: to talk constantly or be obsessed about something that others may not find important

U: Rajesh seems to have a bee in his bonnet about taxi drivers who do not return change.

(Note: *A bonnet is a hat of cloth or straw, held in place by ribbons tied under the chin. It is worn by women and children.*)
